Ready for an exciting year?

This year promises to be packed with many interesting and fun learning experiences.

Our days will be packed with Language, Math, Gym, Music, Drama, Art, Science, Social Studies and Computers.

other and the world around us.

There are a few simple rules and procedures to help us long on our journey that have seemed to work in the past.

To have a successful school year it is important that you get plenty of sleep, eat right and exercise. You are encouraged to bring at least one healthy snack to school every day.

You are responsible to complete any assigned homework or tasks that you did not complete during the day. Be sure to take home the materials you need and return the work completed on time. If you fail to do this you will be asked to stay in for recess to complete your work at that time. If you do forget your homework on a regular basis your parents will be notified.

The agenda is a useful tool. It can help remind you of important events taking place, remind you of homework and tests coming up, as well as a good way for parents and teachers to communicate information. It is your responsibility to bring home and return your agenda. Parents are asked to initial the agenda every day.

Things to Remember:
1) Students will have the opportunity to visit the Gym. They are required to have an indoor pair of running shoes at school.

2) Students will exchange books in the Library once a cycle. They may use the library books for their Book Reports or choose a book from home.

3) As the weather becomes cooler children are encouraged to dress appropriately. An extra pair of socks in the back pack is always a good idea.

4) Teachers are your friends. If you need help at any time with anything we are here for you. Just ask!

The Usual Grade 3 Business

Students are expected to complete a monthly book report. The report is to be completed at home but students can read their books at school during silent reading if they wish. There are a number of genres that the students can pick from. They do not need to be completed in any order, but by the end of the school year all reports in the book will have to be completed. Students will be given the due date at the beginning of each month.

At times students will write unit tests and quizzes. They will have

an opportunity to study for those tests. **Parents are asked to sign and return tests to the classroom teacher.**

In Grade 3 the math program is challenging. It is important to help the students master their basic math facts. Please practice with your child simple addition and subtraction facts when possible. As the year progresses, you will be able to add multiplication and division to your practice time.

Book Orders. I would ask that along with the order form a cheque be sent to school on the due date given.

Each student will be responsible to be the class reporter for a week. During that week students are asked to bring in a news item from the newspaper, radio, or T.V. They will report the news to the class for the entire week. Students will also be responsible to check and record the weather at school.

Communication with your child's teacher will make a big difference to their

educational experience. Please notify us of any difficulty your child may be experiencing with any aspect of his or her school experience. It is important that we work together.
