

## ***Questioning Activities To Do At Home***

### **What's in the Box?**

Put an object in a box or bag. Tell your child that he/she cannot guess what it is until they are absolutely sure. He/she can ask yes or no questions about the object until he/she is sure of his/her guess. If your child guesses incorrectly the game is over.

### **Question Cubes**

You will need 2 cubes. On one cube print the words Who, What, Where, Why, When and How. On the other cube print the words is, did, will, should, might, and can.

Read a story with your child. Pause during reading to roll the 2 cubes and ask a question using those question words. Repeat the activity after reading. Encourage "higher order thinking" questions where students must make inferences or judgements about what they have read.

### **Tic-Tac-Question Boards**

Choose a book to read with your child. Before, during and/or after reading have students complete a Tic-Tac-Question Board activity.

### **HeadBanz**

Use the traditional board game or tape the name of an animal, person, place, or thing on each player's back. The player must ask questions to figure out who or what he/she is.
